Collecting controlled drugs

Controlled medicines are sometimes misused so they have stricter legal controls on their supply. Just to remind patients collecting controlled drugs that the dispensary have to follow guidelines set out to them so this process will take longer. The controlled drugs are ordered in however they are only dispensed when the patient arrives to collect them. The patient will need to provide photo I.D (e.g. passport or driving licence). If you are collecting on behalf of someone else you may be asked to provide your proof of identity too. We may also confirm with the patient that their medicine is being collected by someone else. The controlled drugs have to be checked by two members of staff and signed out so please bare this in mind when collecting and please be patient with the staff. Due to this longer process, we ask that patients collect their controlled drugs before 6.00pm.

Dosette Boxes

For any dispensing patients struggling with medication we can offer weekly dosette boxes. Please ask the dispensary team for information.

Coronavirus

Following advice from Mid Essex CCG to prevent the risk of Coronavirus entering the surgery

PLEASE DO NOT ENTER THE BUILDING IF YOU HAVE

- Recently travelled
- Or are in close contact with someone with confirmed coronavirus.
- Or are experiencing any of the following symptoms
- a cough
- a high temperature
- shortness of breath

If you have any of the symptoms above and have recently travelled or have been in close contact with someone with a confirmed case of Coronavirus, please stay indoors and avoid close contact with people and contact NHS 111.

NHS 111 has an online Coronavirus service that can tell you if you need medical help and advises you what to do.

If you contact us by phone clearly outline your travel history and your symptoms.

As online appointments are booked without knowledge of the patients symptoms we have taken the advice of Mid Essex CCG to no longer allow online appointment bookings.

To help prevent the spread of Coronavirus please;

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- always wash your hands when you get home or into work
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin straight away and wash your hands afterwards
- try to avoid close contact with people who are unwell
